Her professional experience includes senior positions at the International Monetary Fund, including as assistant director in the Middle East and Central Asia Department; an advisor to the Governor of the Central Bank of Turkey; and scholar positions at the Foreign Economic Relations Board in Istanbul and at the Middle East Institute in Washington, DC. She is currently an independent consultant. After receiving her BA in economics from Robert College in Turkey, she did graduate studies at the University of Essex in the U.K., and received her PhD in economics at the University of Pittsburgh in the U.S.
